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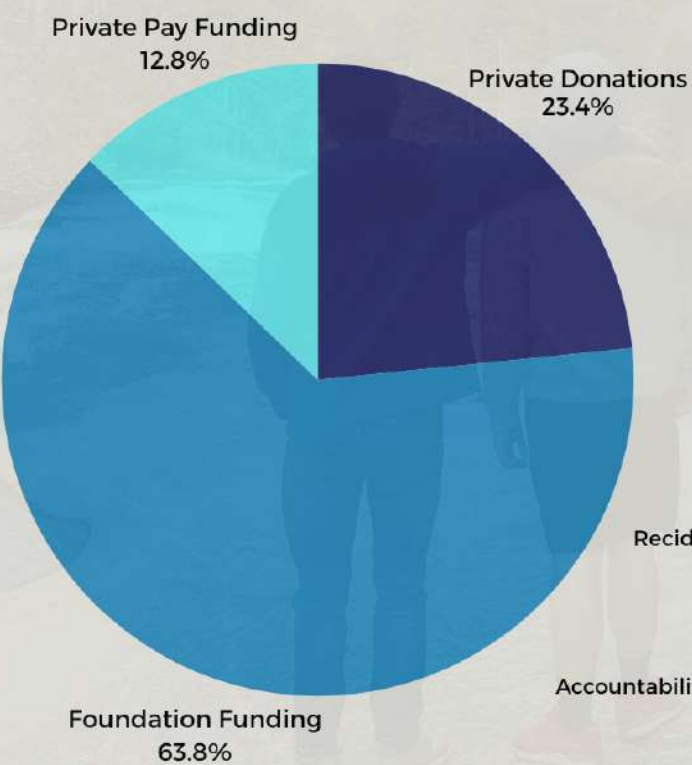

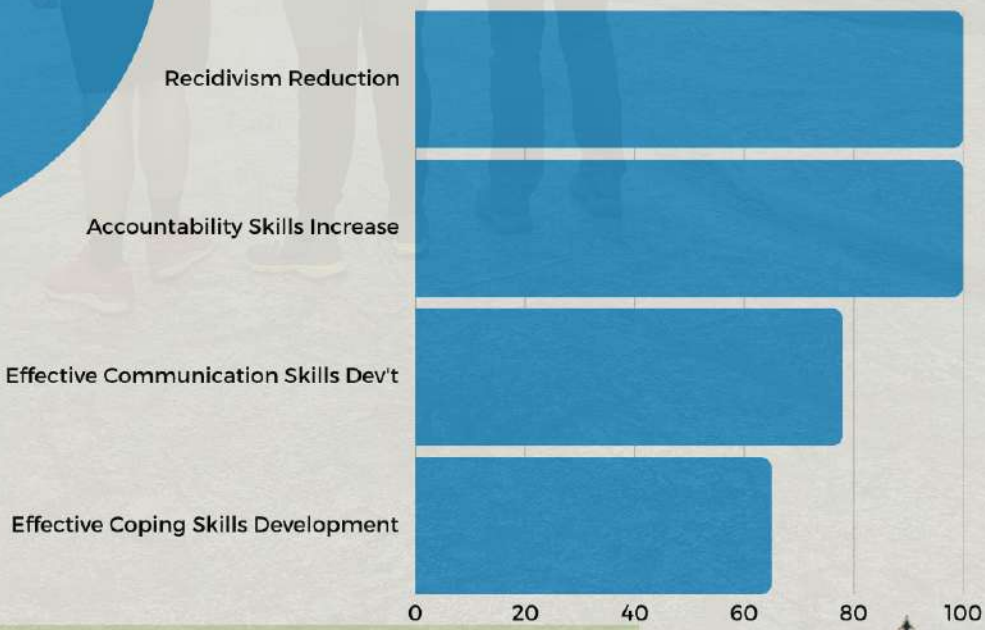


Funding Sources

PIVOTING

The wilderness therapy landscape has proven to be far more volatile than anticipated at the beginning of 2023. Outreach and marketing material optimized to present our 6-week young adult program as an effective alternative to re-enrollment in such programs has met hesitation and concern. We have adjusted over the past 6 months of 2023 to focus on developing and improving of our 14-18 year old offerings to include a prevention-based, leadership after school program for area high school students.



Pioneering experiential coaching in Buncombe County.

Since Q4 2022, we have eclipsed our projections of you served – providing therapeutic adventure-based programming to **26** unique adolescents ages 14-18 as well as providing leadership skill development and social emotional learning programming for conservatively **85** unique middle school youth through an amazing opportunity to collaborate with a local nonprofit providing hard skills development programming to Buncombe County middle school students this summer.

Subsidized Expansion

After 18+ months of meetings, we're expanding our person-centered work in local high schools. We have established a prevention-based, leadership program for at-risk youth, promoting their well-being before punitive measures are necessary. We will foster emotional awareness, health, and growth among local high school students. The staff, administration, and licensed social workers of these schools have referred to our Department of Juvenile Justice offerings for years. All parties involved are excited to offer this outlet for the youth – mitigating behaviors otherwise resulting in punitive measures with enduring consequences.
